

SPECIAL EDUCATION

- 8590** **INDEPENDENT STUDY, GIFTED** (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12 **Prerequisite: Consent**
See the gifted education facilitator for information.
- 8705** **READING IMPROVEMENT** (Y) Year 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to reinforce and improve basic reading survival skills.
- 8706** **READING IMPROVEMENT 2** (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12 **Prerequisite: Reading Level 4+**
This course is designed to enhance reading in the content area, functional reading, and recreational reading.
- 8712** **MATHEMATICS** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to develop basic and functional mathematical skills. It can partially or totally fulfill the regular high school mathematics requirement. Topics include operations with whole numbers, fractions, decimals and percentages, and math for everyday living.
- 8713** **APPLIED MATHEMATICS** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to develop basic functional math skills in the areas of budget, taxes, and daily living expenses.
- 8714** **INTRODUCTION TO ALGEBRA** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to develop basic algebraic concepts such as skills of operations with whole numbers, fractions, and percents. Students will be introduced to equations using variables.
- 8716** **LANGUAGE ARTS** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to develop basic language arts skills and functional literacy. It can partially or totally fulfill the regular high school English requirements. Topics include developmental reading, vocabulary, writing skills, spelling, and usage.
- 8718** **WORLD HISTORY** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course in World history/culture is an alternative to the required World History course. The history of major regions of the world will be studied.
- 8721** **US HISTORY 1** (S) Years 10, 11, 12
This course fulfills the first semester requirement for US History and is the study of significant events from Colonization through the Civil War and Reconstruction.
- 8722** **GOVERNMENT** (S) Year 12
This course examines the basic principles of the U.S. Constitution and the responsibilities for good citizenship. Topics include the three branches of national government, state and local government, the elective process, and citizenship.
- 8723** **US HISTORY 2** (S) Years 11, 12
This course is designed to fulfill the U.S. History requirement and is the study of significant events following Reconstruction through WW II.
- 8725** **US HISTORY 3** (S) Years 11, 12
This course is designed to fulfill the U.S. History requirement and is the study of significant events from the Cold War to the present.

- 8726** **STUDY SKILLS** (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12 **Prerequisite: Consent**
This course offers students the opportunity to receive additional support and tutoring for their other academic classes
- 8728** **WORK STUDY** (S) Years 10, 11, 12 **Prerequisite: Consent**
Students participate in a community or schoolwork experience.
- 8730** **PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT** (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to improve family and peer relationships.
- 8734** **BIOLOGY** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to fulfill the required Biology course. Topics include health and wellness, first aid, and human biology.
- 8735** **EARTH SCIENCE** (Y) Years 9,10, 11, 12
This course is designed to fulfill the required science course. Topics include geology, meteorology, astronomy, and oceanography.
- 8736** **CURRENT SOCIAL ISSUES** (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is the study of current world and local happenings with an emphasis upon various media coverage of those events. A wide variety of materials, including newspapers, magazines, and videotapes of news telecasts will be used.
- 8737** **BIOLOGY 2** (Y) Years 10, 11, 12 **Prerequisite: #8734**
This course is designed to fulfill the second required science course. Topics include ecology, plants, animals, and human biology.
- 8738** **CONSUMER SKILLS** (S) Years 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to develop basic math and reading skills required to be a wise consumer and fulfills the requirement for Consumer Education. Topics include career selection, housing, budgeting, comparison shopping, transportation, insurance, and income taxes.
- 8739** **PHYSICAL SCIENCE** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course explores the concepts of physical science that are used in everyday experiences. The content emphasizes practical application of information and techniques and includes the metric system; states of matter; the basics of heat, light and sound; and the impact of force, motion, work and machines on our environment.
- 8740** **COMMUNICATIONS** (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed for the resource student and is an alternate to a speech course. This class is the study of communication and public speaking skills.
- 8744** **ALGEBRA A/B** (Y) Years 9, 10, 11, 12
This course is designed to further develop algebraic concepts such as fractions, percents, whole numbers and variables.

LOW INCIDENCE-INTERRELATED SPECIAL EDUCATION

- 6410** **ADAPTIVE PE**
Students in this course will be enrolled per their I.E.P.

- 8450 CONSUMER/ECONOMICS**
This course offers instruction and experiences with household budgets, purchases, use of cash money, checking accounts, and savings accounts.
- 8455 HOME LIVING SKILLS**
This course provides instruction in daily household routines, personal grooming, clothing selection and care, simple meals, and snacks.
- 8460 FUNCTIONAL READING (Survival Reading) (S) 10, 11, 12**
This course is designed to improve reading skills, which are beneficial for information, mobility and safety in the school, home, and community.
- 8462 PRACTICAL WRITING**
This course is designed to increase student's grammar usage, spelling, personal information, and basic vocabulary.
- 8470 FUNCTIONAL MATH**
This course includes more advanced math methods, which will be useful throughout life in the community.
- 8472 SCIENCE**
This course provides information about personal health and nutrition, plants and animals, and care of the environment.
- 8480 SOCIAL STUDIES (Civic Awareness and Responsibility)**
This course is designed to improve the student's self concept and how he/she relates to the community. The importance of awareness and following the laws and rules of the community/environment are stressed.
- 8490 INDEPENDENT STUDY (S) 10, 11, 12**
This course is designed to give individual attention to the student in the areas of self-awareness, daily living skills, personal-social skills, and transitional guidance.
- 8496 VOCATIONAL TRAINING**
The instruction is designed to provide student's basic work readiness skills and behaviors, vocational training, and opportunities to work in the community.
- 8497 INDEPENDENT WORK/STUDY**
This course offers students the opportunity to work in the community on a job. There will be consultative services from teacher to the job site.
- 8503 ART FOR LIVING 1 (S) Years 9, 10, 11, 12**
This course introduces students to the products, processes, and values of design. Design is recognized as a process of building by selecting the elements of the visual arts (line, shape, color, form, texture) and arranging them in unified two- and three-dimensional forms. Course work will be adapted to individual levels of performance and skills.
